We received our SATs results last Thursday. Our Year 6 children did a great job with 63% achieving the required standard in reading, 68% writing and 70% in maths. The combined reading, writing and maths score was 58%. This is roughly in line with last year so well done to all of our Year 6 pupils and their teachers.

They all have a firm foundation to go forwards to their new schools with the right skills to succeed.

Reception held their Graduation Ceremony with all of their friends and family.

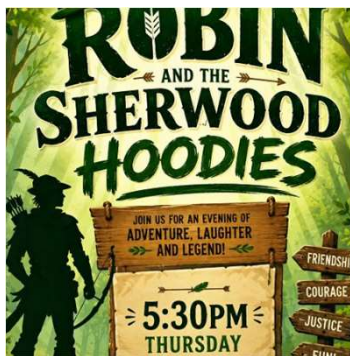
Year 1 completed their clay models inspired by Barbara Hepworth
